Guatemalan Civil War (1960 - 1996)

Civil war broke out in Guatemala when numerous leftist and agrarian groups took up arms in 1960 in face of the repression from the conservative regime of Carlos Castillo Armas. The Armas regime came to power in 1954 following a CIA-backed coup against the leftist government of Jacobo Arbenz. The main rebel umbrella was the Guatemalan National Revolutionary Unity (URNG). During the civil war numerous counts of genocide and mass disappearances occurred. In the late 1980s, when a civilian government came to power, the URNG changed tactics when releasing that they wouldn't come to power through armed conflict. The war came to an end on December 29, 1996, and since then URNG converted to an official political party.

Description

Agreed to first discuss substantive issues, such as democracy, human rights, refugees, truth commission, indigenous rights, the economic, social and agrarian situation, the role of the army, strengthening of civil authorities and institutions, and constitutional reform. Procedural issues, such as arrangements for ceasefire, demobilisation and reintegration of the URNG into normal political life, to be discussed later. Confirmed functions of Conciliator and UN observer, and both parties pledged not to unilaterally abandon the negotiation process.

Enforcement mechanism

Page 2,

1. The Government of Guatemala and the Unidad Revolucionaria Nacional Guatemalteca (URNG) undertake to conduct a process of negotiation that will permit, in the shortest possible time, the signing of an agreement for a firm and lasting peace which sets out political agreements, how they are to be implemented and executed by the parties, and how their fulfilment is to be verified by the National Reconciliation Commission, the United Nations and such other international bodies as the parties may designate by mutual agreement.

Page 2,

2. The participants in the negotiations shall be the Conciliator, Monsignor Rodolfo Quesada Torao: the representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, Mr. Francesc Vendrell, acting as Observer; the advisers to the Conciliator and the Observer: and the delegations of the Government of the Republic of Guatemala and of URNG. Members of the National Reconciliation Commission shall also participate in meetings for the purpose of noting and verifying the fulfilment of agreements. The Government of Guatemala and URNG may be assisted by advisers, who must be Guatemalan and shall first present their credentials to the Conciliator.
