<p>The civil war in El Salvador lasted from 1979 to 1992 between an authoritarian government and non-state opponents. Following a failed coup d'état, five leftist guerrilla movements merged to form the umbrella organisation Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN). U.S. support for the central Salvatorean government after 1979 lasted until its collapsed in late 1980s, after which the right-wing Republican National Alliance (Arena) filled the power vacuum. In March 1990, the rebels announced a suspension of attacks on non-military entered into talks backed by the UN and Catholic Church with the government. Despite the talks violence peaked over the next two years until the Chapultepec Peace Accords were signed in Mexico City in February 1992. Another ceasefire was signed a month later, which lasted nine months and was never broken during that time. Arena won the 1994 presidential elections and maintained a significant portion of the legislature until 2009, when the FMLN attained the presidency.</p> <p>Close</p> <p>El Salvador Civil War (1979 - 1992)</p>

Description	Agreed to cooperate closely to ensure compliance with all Peace Accords by 30 April 1995 and to establish joint mechanisms with participation of Government, FMLN and the UN Observer Mission in El Salvador (ONUSAL) to determine measures necessary for fulfillment of commitments. Also agreed to keep Salvadorian people and international community informed of any decisions and steps taken and to reiterate their requests to the UN to extent ONUSAL mandate. Agreement to establish joint implementation mechanisms involving ONUSAL to ensure rapid fulfilment of the aforementioned commitments.
