|                        | Inspired by the Maoist insurgency in Peru in the early 1990s, the Communist Party of<br>Nepal (Maoist) – CPN(M) – declared war on the Nepalese government in February 1996. A<br>key demand was the transformation of Nepal from a monarchy into a 'People's Republic'.<br>Following a pronounced Maoist military strategy, the CPN(M) focused their insurgency on<br>the rural areas. They gained significantly in strength and it took heavy international<br>military support to stabilize the Nepalese government in 2002. After public protests<br>escalated in Kathmandu in 2004, the Nepalese King Gyanendra took authoritarian<br>control over the government.
