## Issues, root causes and resolutions of Panyume Civilian – Military Dialogue

### 1. (a) What intra conflicts exist within you?

- Problem of leaders
- No free movement
- Forceful marriage of civilian
- Civilians are not sleeping in their house at night
- Looting of civilian's properties
- Raping of civilians by the military
- Negative politics
- Too many roadblocks and check points
- Delay of peace implantation
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### 1. (b) What inter conflict exist between civilian and military in Panyume payam?

- killing of civilian in Panyume payam
- All chiefs of the area stay outside the county
- Propaganda causing civilian to flee to the camps
- Civilian are divided in different armed groups
- Lack of humanitarian aid for civilian and food for the soldiers
- The welfare of the soldiers not cater for by the government
- A lot of accusation between the government and other parties

### 2. What are the root causes of (a) and (b) conflicts?

- Hunger
- Tribalism
- Beating of civilians by the military
- No court and justice
- There is no unity between the civilian and the military in Panyume payam

**1. Recommendation/Resolutions:**

1. Government should speed up implementation of peace agreement.
2. Security and civil leaders should provide free movement of people in panyume and outside.
3. The dialogue resolved that check points should be reduced for security purpose not for collection of money and materials.
4. The security and civil leaders should impose law and order when one is caught in the act of raping and killing should be brought to the court of law.
5. The resolution of the dialogue calls for all chiefs to return to duties in their administrative areas immediately by the Executive Director and paramount chiefs.
6. The dialogue resolved for continuous awareness on current peace agreement to stop propaganda.
7. Leaders should be trained on how to lead their people by executive Director.
8. The dialogue resolved that the soldiers should protect the civilians and their properties.
9. Military forces should be settled away from civilian residence and farm land to avoid fear.
10. Establishment of police stations and deployment of community police in panyume to handle civil crimes.
11. Establishment of military court martial for fair trials of civilian military cases.
12. Compensation of looted properties, rape victim and blood compensation.
13. The dialogue recommended that schools, health facilities, markets and boreholes should be rehabilitated to attract returnees.
14. The dialogue recommended for effective collaboration between SSPDF and the I.O at the borders.
